



Vouchers fund discrimination.


Public schools in Illinois can't discriminate on the basis of disability status, gender identity, sexual orientation, language, pregnancy or parenting status, immigration status, or religion. But under the Invest in Kids voucher program, public dollars are going to private schools in Illinois, many of which discriminate against students in all these protected categories. Public dollars should be for public schools—schools that serve all children and families.

LGBTO+

- 1. All students and their parents will be addressed and referred to with pronouns in accord with their biological sex;
- 2. All school correspondence, documents, and records will reflect the student or parent's
- 3. Students will participate in competitive athletics in accord with their biological sex; 4. Catholic schools will not allow, or otherwise
- cooperate in, the administration of pubertyblocking or cross-sex hormones on school
- 5. All students will use bathrooms and locker rooms that correspond with their biological sex. Students who have been clinically diagnosed with gender dysphoria, however, may request the use of a single-person, unisex facility. Such requests will be assessed on an individual basis by the appropriate school administrator.

Parenting Status

STUDENTS WHO HAVE CHILDREN (MD 5138) According to the teachings of the Catholic Church and Mater Dei, premarital sex is morally wrong. In addition, a young mother and father's first responsibility is their newborn child, in regard to care, love, and financial support. Moreover, during the child's first year, the mother and father need to spend the time normally spent on extracurricular activities with the child. For these reasons, a student who becomes a mother or a father shall not be permitted to participate in extracurricular activities until, at minimum, the child's first birthday.

Disability

All new and transfer students are accepted on a probationary period of 90 school days, During this probationary period, students are expected to maintain passing grades, have no major disciplinary issues or require accommodations that the school physically or financially is incapable of supporting, Students with special learning needs may be accepted if the school has the staff and ability to make the necessary accommodations for the child's academic growth and success [...] St. Stanislaus Kostka Academy will do its best using all available resources to provide programs for students with special needs. If a student's needs exceed our capabilities, St. Stan's will make every effort to assist parents in finding an appropriate school to meet those special needs. [...] Catholic schools are not legally obligated to implement all services recommended on an IEP.

Language/National Origin

We speak Spanish at home. Will my child have a hard time adjusting to classes at St. Gall?

Pregnancy Status

"Students who become pregnant may remain in school until the time that is most reasonable in the judgment of the girl's physician, parents and the administration of the school. The administration may admit the student back to Gibault if the student's attitude and behavior regarding the pregnancy are consistent with Catholic principles.
